Update: After the Storms

Good Samaritan Orphanage: A 2nd flood hit the orphanage, so the children were unable to go back there. The kids have been staying at a nearby mission.

New Roads Garbage Dump: The actual flood did not affect this point of light, but the flooding has caused major food outages and a huge increase in prices. Needless to say these folks have been affected in a very negative way. We were able to help several families who just couldn't make it.

Grace Emmanuel School: The flooding wiped out our front wall and damaged the outhouse. We have replaced the wall, and the outhouse is back to working condition. We were able to assist 58 families of our school kids. Many were left homeless and all had no means to eat or have clean drinking water. We have been able for the past month to provide 100% of their needs, thanks to many of you who helped with your finances. We had four families whose homes were wiped out by the flood. Not only were we able to relocate them to new homes, we assisted them as they began a life in their new homes by providing beds, cooking items, and other household essentials.

Victory Bible Church: Thankfully, the flooding and storms did not affect our new church building project at all. We have great drainage at the new property. It did not affect the building we currently rent for church or our church families directly.

My Home: Our home was not affected in anyway, Praise God.

- There are over 90 children who live at Good Samaritan Orphanage. With your help, we provide these kids with food, water, clothes, medical attention and Biblical training. The orphanage is run by a staff of 15 Haitians who volunteer their time.
- Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere.
- Roughly half of the population of Haiti practices Voodoo.
- The cost of food has risen over 50% in the past year, and it has continued to escalate since the recent floods.

Haitian Schools Collapse

Classes were in session when College La Promesse Evanglique, a Christian School of 500 students in a suburb of the capital, collapsed and crushed at least 100 people, mostly school children. The likely cause: shoddy construction. Another 100 people were still unaccounted for as of November 12th, and the rescue workers have given up hope of finding survivors. The horrors continued when, five days after the disaster, another school suffered a partial collapse. Thankfully, no one appears to have died in that incident.
