



Jesus in Haiti Packing List and Trip Information

Some information regarding what clothing to pack: Men should wear long pants and women wear long pants or long skirts when doing ministry. Shorts and t-shirts can be worn at the mission home. Women, no spaghetti straps or plunging neck lines please.

IMPORTANT: everyone needs to bring a nice set of clothes for church. Men should wear a shirt with a collar—Haitian men wear shirts and ties to church if they can afford it. Women should wear a skirt or dress that covers the knees. Again, no plunging neck lines or spaghetti straps for women.

In addition, please pack the following:

1. When staying at the mission home, take linens and towels. It is recommended to take items that can be left with Tom's household. If you don't have items to leave, just take what is needed for the week.
2. At least two pair of shoes are recommended. A pair of gym shoes or some type of shoes to work in. A pair of dress shoes for church. Flip flops are great for around the mission home.
3. A hat, sunglasses and sunscreen to protect you from the sun. Insect repellent with deet.
4. Antiseptic wipes are nice to clean hands with or a small bottle of hand sanitizer works well.
5. Some small packs of Kleenex to use as most of the restrooms do not have toilet paper—this is common in third world countries.
6. Tom will have water available whenever you travel. Hydration is very important.
7. Bring a swimsuit just in case there is a beach day.
8. Transportation will be riding in the cab or back of the truck, so bandanas are useful.
9. Showers will be available, but there is no hot water.
10. It is strongly advised to leave fine jewelry at home. This is a good idea when visiting any third world country.



11. Chloroquine is a common medication for malaria prevention. Keep in mind it must be taken 1 week before trip.

Accommodations will be “rustic”, remember your hosts offer the best they have, so be gracious. Tom will provide all meals, but packed snacks may be a good idea for the evening.

Remember when working in a third world country the key word is flexibility. Schedule adjustments will be made as needed. Please remember you are a guest of Tom’s in his country and on his mission field.

It is imperative that you have your passport and a copy of your passport to keep in a separate place. Passports must be valid at least 6 months after you return from Haiti. It is suggested to take only one credit card, less to worry about. Don’t forget, no aerosols or liquids in your carryon!

Tom will pick you up at the airport. It is helpful if your bags are marked with identifying tags or ribbon. Everyone seems to have black bags!
